

- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames on 16 October 2014 made the above mentioned Order under sections 6 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
- 2. The general effect of the Order is to continue in force waiting restrictions in Sandy Lane, Teddington as follows:
  - (a) a single yellow line "no waiting between 7am and 7pm throughout the week" on both sides of Sandy Lane from a point near Cedars Road where the Hampton Wick controlled parking zone ends to a point north-west of Bushy Park Road at the common boundary of Nos 14 and 16 Sandy Lane; and
  - (b) double yellow lines "no waiting at any time" on the north-east side of Sandy Lane:
    - (i) for approximately 10 metres on either side of its junction with Southcott Road and extending into Southcott Road for approximately 10 metres; and
    - (ii) at its junction with Blagrove Road for distances of 45 metres (to the southeast of the junction) and 9 metres (to the north-west).
- 3. The single yellow line described in paragraph 2(a) above will be replaced by double yellow lines for the extents described in paragraph 2(b).
- 4. The sole effect of this Order is to replicate and continue in force indefinitely the provisions of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thanes (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Civil Enforcement Area) (No. 1) Experimental Order 2013
- 5. Copies of the Order, which comes into force on 20 October 2014, a plan showing the location and effect of the Order and the Council's Statement of Reasons for making the Order:-
  - (a) can be inspected, quoting Reference 13/048 at the Civic Centre (Central Reception, ground floor), 44 York Street, Twickenham between 9.15am and 5pm on Mondays to Fridays, except for Bank and other public holidays; and

- 6. If any person wishes to question the validity of this Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of the said Act of 1984 or of any instrument made under the said Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Order is made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.

  - (2) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
  - (3) The Interpretation Act 1978(b) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3. Whilst this Order continues in force the provisions of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Civil Enforcement Area) (Consolidation No. 8) Order 2008(c), as amended, shall apply as if the length of road and the prescribed hours specified in the item numbered 1 and set out in columns 1, 2 and 3 of the Schedule to this Order were added to the items in Schedule 1 to that Order.

    - (ii) at its junction with Blagrove Road for distances of 45 metres (to the southeast of the junction) and 9 metres (to the north-west).
- 3. The single yellow line described in paragraph 2(a) above will be replaced by double yellow lines for the extents described in paragraph 2(b).

Persons wishing to object to or support the making of such Order for the purpose of such reproduction and continuation in force may, within the period of six months referred to above (ie by 21 October 2013), send a statement in writing of their objection and the grounds of that objection to the address below.
