THE LONDON BOROUGH OF RICHMOND UPON THAMES (FREE PARKING PLACES) (PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES) (AMENDMENT No. 37) ORDER 2013

DISABLED PERSONS PARKING BAYS VARIOUS STREETS THROUGHOUT THE BOROUGH

(Reference 13/137)

- 1. The Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames on the 16 October 2013 made the above Order under sections 6 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
- 2. The principal objective of the Order is to introduce a number of parking places for disabled persons where a high level of parking makes reasonable means of access difficult and to discontinue a number of similar parking places previously provided where the demand for such bays no longer exists.
- 3. The Order will introduce a parking bay for disabled persons' vehicles, operating "at any time" in the following streets:

Andover Road, Twickenham; Edward Road, Hampton Hill; Gloucester Road, Kew; Holly Road, Hampton Hill; Queens Road, East Sheen; Rectory Grove, Hampton; School Road, Hampton Hill; Shalstone Road, Mortlake; Station Road, Teddington; Victor Road, Teddington; and Victoria Road, Mortlake.

4. The Order will revoke the existing parking bay for disabled persons vehicles outside each of the following locations:

70 Cleveland Gardens Barnes; 10 Graemesdyke Avenue, Sheen; 74 Thompson Avenue, Kew; and 88 Tudor Road, Hampton.

1 Stretton Road, Ham;

- A copy of the Order, which will come into operation on 21 October 2013, plans showing the location and effect of the Order and the Council's Statement of Reasons for proposing to make the Order:-
 - (a) can be inspected for a period of six weeks from the date of this Notice, quoting Reference 13/137, at the Civic Centre (Central Reception, ground floor), 44 York Street, Twickenham between 9.15am and 5pm on Mondays to Fridays, except for Bank and other public holidays; and

- 7. Persons wishing to question the validity of this Order or any of its provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the 1984 Act, or that any requirement of the Act or any instrument made under the Act has not been complied with that person may, within six weeks from the date on which the Order was made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.

The Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames, having consulted the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 6 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), as amended, and all other enabling powers hereby make the following Order—

- This Order shall come into operation on 21 October 2013 and may be cited as the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (Free Parking Places) (People with Disabilities) (Amendment No. 37) Order 2013.
- 2. (1) In this Order the expression "enactment" means any enactment whether public, general or local and includes any order, bye-law, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment.
 - (2) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
 - (3) The Interpretation Act 1978**(b)** shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order, the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (Free Parking Places) (People with Disabilities) Order 2007(c), as amended, shall have effect as though
 - (a) there were added to the items in Schedule 2 to that Order the items numbered 7C, 62D, 82B, 110B, 195C, 195D, 212D, 216C, 229C, 250B and 250C and as set out in columns 1, 2, 3 and 4 of Schedule 1 to this Order; and
 - (b) the items in Schedule 2 to that Order numbered 43C, 85, 234 and 242 and as set out in Schedule 2 to this Order were revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Order introduces 11 additional parking bays for people with disabilities to operate "at any time", and revokes 4 similar bays which are no longer required.

The disabled persons' parking place outside No 74 Thompson Avenue, Kew, which is included in the public notice as a bay to be discontinued, is an advisory bay so does not appear in the proposed order.

STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR PROPOSING TO MAKE THIS ORDER


1 Under delegated powers additional parking bays are proposed to be introduced for the exclusive use of Blue Badge holders who meet the criteria approved by the Transport Sub-Committee on 22 July 1996 and for any other vehicle displaying a valid disabled person's badge issued by a Local Authority.


The bays are situated:-

- (i) outside No 11 Andover Road, Twickenham;
- (ii) outside No 41 Edward Road, Hampton Hill;
- (iii) outside No 37A Gloucester Road, Kew;
- (iv) outside No 12 Holly Road, Hampton Hill;
- (v) in Queens Road, Richmond, alongside the flank of No 128 Upper Richmond Road:
- (vi) outside No 129 Rectory Grove, Hampton;
- (vii) outside No 18C School Road, Hampton Hill;
- (viii) outside No 22 Shalstone Road, Mortlake;
- (ix) outside No 29 Station Road, Teddington;
- (x) outside No 10 Victor Road, Teddington; and
- (xi) outside No 24 Victoria Road, Mortlake.

and will be in operation at all times.

- The Council is also proposing to revoke or discontinue the use of the following bays, where there is no longer any demand for their use:-
 - (i) outside No 70 Cleveland Gardens, Barnes
 - (ii) outside No 10 Graemesdyke Avenue, East Sheen;
 - (iii) outside No 1 Stretton Road, Ham; and
 - (iv) outside No. 88 Tudor Road, Hampton.
