

- 1. The Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames propose to make the above Order under sections 6 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
- 2. On 27 April 2012 the Council gave notice of its proposals to vary the conditions by which vehicles were prohibited from stopping on the school keep clear markings (the clearways") throughout the borough. The principal condition concerned the times of day (Mondays to Fridays) during which the clearways would be in force and the days of the year when they would not be in operation. At each location, the position and length of the clearways were defined, and in some instances variations were proposed. Following the consideration of objections received, the Council made an order on 30 July bringing the changes into force.
- 3. Within the above were particulars of the carriageway markings on the west side of Sheen Lane outside the Tower House school. These included the shortening of the zig-zag markings at a Zebra crossing and the shifting of the school clearway northwards so that its northern end would take the place of the Zebra crossings markings which were to be deleted. The overall length of the school clearway would also have been reduced.
- 4. An objection was subsequently received, but before any works were carried out at this site. The effect of this notice is to withdraw the proposals published in April 2012 in respect of the location and position of the school clearway specified in paragraph 3 above. That is to say, the times of day during which the markings will be in force and the days of the year when they will not be in operation will remain as proposed in April but the extent of the carriageway markings (both for the Zebra crossing and for the school clearway) will remain as they arePMT.
- 5. The general effect of the Order will be to:-
 - (a) specify that the school clearway on the west side of Sheen Lane outside the Tower House school will be in force on Mondays to Fridays between 8.00 and 9.30 am and between 2.30 and 4.30 pm;
 - (b) specify that the clearway will not be in operation on any day which falls on a bank or public holiday, any day during August or any day between 24 and 31 December inclusive; and
 - (c) retain the clearway in its existing position (having an overall length of 37.5 metres).

STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR PROPOSING TO MAKE THIS ORDER

This Order replaces the description of an existing school clearway on the north-east side of Sheen Lane, Sheen. A recent amendment order had made provision for the clearway to have been shortened by 6 metres such that its overall length would have become 31.5 metres. However, on receipt of an objection and before the road markings had been altered on site, the Council decided that the clearway should be left in its original position. By doing so, the safety of pupils at the Tower House School will be maintained and vehicles using the crossover serving Nos 192 and 192A Sheen Lane will not present any greater risk of accident than already exists.

The previous amendment order had varied the hours of the days (Mondays to Fridays) when the restriction would be in force and had specified certain days when the clearway would not be in operation. This order makes no further changes to those hours or to those specified days.

Within the existing limits, the road markings will be remarked to give a symmetrical layout and to comply with current regulations.

The traffic sign and road markings will be compliant with current regulations, and the times when parking controls are not in force will provide relief to local residents and businesses by permitting them to park during holiday periods.
