The Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames, having consulted the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 6 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), as amended, and all other enabling powers hereby make the following Order—

- 1. This Order shall come into operation on 17 November 2014 and may be cited as the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (Waiting and Loading) (Civil Enforcement Area) (Amendment No. 109) Order 2014.
- In this Order the expression "enactment" means any enactment whether public, general or local and includes any order, bye-law, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment.
 - (2) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
 - (3) The Interpretation Act 1978(b) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order, the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Civil Enforcement Area) (Consolidation No. 8) Order 2008(c), as amended, shall have effect as though for the items numbered 549 and 667 in Schedule 1 to that Order there were substituted the items similarly numbered and set out in columns 1, 2 and 3 of Schedule 1 to this Order.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order introduces double yellow lines ("no waiting at any time") in lengths of Priory Road, Kew and Stanley Road, Twickenham.

In Priory Road, Kew double yellow lines are being introduced across the entrance to Cecil Court.

In Stanley Road, Twickenham, the Order provides for the extension of the lengths of the existing double yellow lines on either side of its junction with Golf Side.

The Order also introduces an 8 metre length of yellow line in front of a vehicular crossover outside No 243 Stanley Road.


STATEMENT OF REASONS

The Council receives reports from time to time on matters of road safety caused by parked vehicles and these may come from residents, Councillors, Council officers or bus and emergency services. These matters include poor sight lines at junctions, obstruction of footway crossing points, lack of suitable passing areas and reduced carriageway width restricting or preventing access for vehicles especially emergency service vehicles.

This Order is intended to improve road safety for all users by introducing waiting restrictions "no waiting at any time" at the locations contained within the Notice of Making, the Traffic Management Order and accompanying drawings. Similar restrictions have proved effective in locations elsewhere in the borough that previously suffered similar problems.

During the consultation, a representation was received requesting that a length of double yellow line be introduced in front of the vehicular crossover to No 243 Stanley Road. This is being implemented as part of this Order on sympathetic grounds to ensure access to an offstreet parking area is maintained at all times.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

In Stanley Road, Twickenham, it is proposed to extend the lengths of the existing double yellow lines on either side of its junction with Golf Side.

The Council receives reports from time to time on matters of road safety caused by parked vehicles and these may come from residents, Councillors, Council officers or bus and emergency services. These matters include poor sight lines at junctions, obstruction of footway crossing points, lack of suitable passing areas and reduced carriageway width restricting or preventing access for vehicles especially emergency service vehicles.
