- 1. The Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames on 16 June 2016 made the above Order under section 6 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
- 2. The general effect of the Order is to prohibit vehicles turning left from South Worple Way into White Hart Lane, Mortlake. The alternative route for vehicular traffic is via Mortlake High Street and White Hart Lane. The sole purpose of this Order is to replicate and continue in force indefinably the provisions of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (Prescribed Route, Prohibited Turn) (South Worple Way, East Sheen) Experimental Order 2014.

The Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames, having consulted the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 6 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), as amended, hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984" and all other enabling powers hereby make the following Order —

- 1. This Order shall come into operation on 22 June 2016 and may be cited as the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (Prescribed Route, Prohibited Turn) (South Worple Way, East Sheen) Order 2016.
- 2. (1) In this Order the expression "enactment" means any enactment whether public, general or local and includes any order, bye-law, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment.
 - (2) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
 - (3) The Interpretation Act 1978(b) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3. Whilst this Order continues in force, except as provided in Article 4, no person causing or permitting a vehicle proceeding in an easterly direction in South Worple Way shall cause or permit that vehicle to turn left into White Hart Lane, Mortlake.
- 4. Nothing in Article 3 his Order will apply to:-
 - (a) any vehicle on an occasion when it is being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes, if the observance of that provision would be likely to hinder the use of the vehicle for the purpose for which it is being used on that occasion;
 - (b) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform;
 - (c) any person who causes or permits a vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed

The purpose of this Order is to introduce a banned left turn from South Worple Way into White Hart Lane, Mortlake.

STATEMENT OF REASONS

The provisions of this Order ban the left turn (towards the level crossing) out of South Worple Way. Traffic from both directions will still be permitted to turn into the road and right-turning traffic will also continue. This will allow pedestrians to use the busy north-south footway without risk of being overrun by vehicles cutting the corner and damaging the footway as is currently the case.

The Order was previously introduced on an experimental basis and the purpose of this Order is to continue in force the provisions of the Order indefinitely.

If the provisions of this Order continue in operation for a period of not less than six months, the Council will consider in due course whether the its provisions should be reproduced and continued in force indefinitely by means of an Order under section 6 of the said Act of 1984. Persons wishing to object to or support the making of such an Order for the purpose of such reproduction and continuation in force may, within the period of six months referred to above (ie by 3 July 2015.), send a statement in writing of their objection and the grounds of that objection to the address below.

The purpose of this Order is to introduce a banned left turn from South Worple Way into White Hart Lane, Mortlake.

PRPT EO001 2014/68 South Worple Way, East Sheen

STATEMENT OF REASONS

The provisions of this Order ban the left turn (towards the level crossing) out of South Worple Way. Traffic from both directions will still be permitted to turn into the road and right-turning traffic will also continue. This will allow pedestrians to use the busy north-south footway without risk of being overrun by vehicles cutting the corner and damaging the footway as is currently the case.

This measure should also reduce traffic levels on South Worple Way, particularly any speeding vehicles attempting to beat the level crossing lights.

This scheme is being introduced on an experimental basis to give the Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames powers to make modifications or variations to the scheme in the light of operational experience.

The Council will consider in due course whether to make permanent Orders the effect of which will be to reproduce and continue in force indefinitely the provisions of these Orders
