

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 – SECTION 14 (1)

**Temporary Road Closure and Suspension of One-Way Working**  
**Cambridge Road and Denton Road, Twickenham**  
(Reference 15/081)

1. The Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames HEREBY GIVES NOTICE that to facilitate emergency sewer repair works they have made a temporary Traffic Order the effect of which will be to introduce a temporary prohibition of traffic in in Cambridge Road, Twickenham and permit two-way working in Denton Road, Twickenham.
2. Whilst the works take place:-
  - (a) no person may permit a vehicle to proceed in Cambridge Road, Twickenham from its junction with Clevedon Road to a point outside the south-eastern boundary of No 1e Cambridge Road;
  - (b) the one-way working in Denton Road, Twickenham between the north-eastern kerb-line of Creswell Road and the south-western kerb-line of Cambridge Road shall be suspended, the effect being that two-way traffic will be permitted.
3. An alternative route for traffic will be via Morley Road / Cresswell Road and Denton Road.
4. The order came into effect on 11 May 2015 and continues in force the provisions of a Notice made under Section 14(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which came into force on 6 May 2015. The works are anticipated to be in progress until 18 May 2015. The provisions of the order will be in force at all times where relevant signs/cones are placed. The order will remain in force for a period of 18 months, to allow for unexpected events and possible remedial works.
5. The prohibitions apply only during such time and to such extent as indicated by prescribed traffic signs.
6. Nothing in the Order applies to:
  - (a) any vehicle being used in connection with the execution of the said works or any public service or utility vehicle;
  - (b) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police officer in uniform or a traffic warden; or
  - (c) emergency service vehicles, subject to site conditions at the time of any emergency.
7. Any vehicle waiting in contravention of any restriction imposed by the Order may be removed under the provisions of the Removal and Disposal of Vehicles Regulations 1986.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 – SECTION 14 (2)

**Temporary Road Closure and Suspension of One-Way Working  
Cambridge Road and Denton Road, Twickenham**

(Ref: 15/081)

1. The Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames HEREBY GIVES NOTICE that due to the need to facilitate emergency works to be undertaken to the main sewer they will introduce a road closure in Cambridge Road, Twickenham and permit two-way working in Denton Road, Twickenham.
2. Whilst the works take place:-
  - (a) no person may permit a vehicle to proceed in Cambridge Road, Twickenham from its junction with Clevedon Road to a point outside the south-eastern boundary of No 1e Cambridge Road;
  - (b) the one-way working in Denton Road, Twickenham between the north-eastern kerb-line of Creswell Road and the south-western kerb-line of Cambridge Road shall be suspended, the effect being that two-way traffic will be permitted.
3. The restrictions will come into force on 6 May 2015. Further details regarding the dates and times of the closure are explained in paragraph 6 of this notice.
4. An alternative route for vehicles affected by the closure will be via Clevedon Road and Denton Road.
5. Nothing in this Notice will apply to:
  - (a) any vehicle being used in connection with the execution of the said works; or
  - (b) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police officer in uniform or a traffic warden.
6. The temporary restrictions will be introduced by a notice given under Section 14(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended. The notice will come into effect on 6 May 2015 and remain in force at all times until 10 May 2015, that is, for a period of 5 days. The works are anticipated to be in progress until 18 May, 2015 so the Council will introduce a Temporary Traffic Order under Section 14(1) of the said Act to continue in force the provisions of this Notice for up to 18 months.
7. The prohibitions will apply only during such time and to such extent as indicated by prescribed traffic signs.
8. Any vehicle waiting in contravention of any restriction imposed by the Order may be removed under the provisions of the Removal and Disposal of Vehicles Regulations 1986.

## TEMPORARY TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ORDER

### THE LONDON BOROUGH OF RICHMOND UPON THAMES (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC) (CAMBRIDGE ROAD AND DENTON ROAD, TWICKENHAM) ORDER 2015

Made: 8 May 2015

Comes into operation: 11 May 2015

WHEREAS the Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (hereinafter referred to as "The Council") being the Highway Authority for all streets within the said London borough, with the exception of those streets which are part of the Transport for London Road Network and those which are Crown roads in the Royal Parks of Richmond Park and Bushy Park, are satisfied that vehicular traffic should be prohibited and car parking restricted in order to facilitate emergency sewer repairs (hereinafter referred to as "the works"):

NOW THEREFORE the Council in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), as amended, and of all other enabling powers hereby make the following Order:-

#### Commencement and citation

1. This Order shall come into operation on 11 May 2015 and may be cited as the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) (Cambridge Road and Denton Road, Twickenham) Order 2015 and shall remain in force for 18 months. The works are anticipated to be in progress from 11 May 2015 until 18 May 2015.

#### Prohibition or restriction of vehicular traffic

2. Whilst the works take place, from 11 May 2015 until 18 May 2015 at all times,
  - (a) no person may permit a vehicle to proceed in Cambridge Road, Twickenham from its junction with Clevedon Road to a point outside the south-eastern boundary of No 1e Cambridge Road;
  - (b) the provisions of Item 2(b) of the Richmond upon Thames (Prescribed Route) (No. 4) Traffic Order 1968(b) shall be suspended, so that the one-way working in Denton Road, Twickenham between the north-eastern kerb-line of Creswell Road and the south-western kerb-line of Cambridge Road shall be suspended, the effect being that two-way working will be permitted.
3. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall apply to any vehicle connected with the execution of the said works or to any public service or utility vehicle.
4. Nothing in this Order shall apply:-
  - (a) to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police officer in uniform or a traffic warden; or

(b) to any vehicle on an occasion when it is being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes, if the observance of that provision would be likely to hinder the use of the vehicle for the purpose for which it is being used on that occasion, provided that conditions which prevail on site at any one time do not render it unsafe or impossible for such a vehicle or vehicles to use any part of the public highway for the time being.

5. The provisions of this Order will only apply during such times when it is necessary to prohibit or restrict vehicular traffic in that road or length of road and to such extent as is at the time indicated by traffic signs prescribed by the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(c).

#### Contravention

6. If a vehicle is left during the restricted time without complying with the requirements of this Order, a contravention shall have occurred and a penalty charge shall be payable. A penalty charge notice showing the information required by the Traffic Management Act 2004(d) may then be issued by a civil enforcement officer in accordance with the requirements of that Act.

#### Manner of payment of the penalty charge

7. The penalty charge shall be paid to the Council as set out in Schedule 2 to the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (Manner of Payment of Penalty Charges) Order 2011(e).

#### Alteration of position or removal of vehicles

8. Where any vehicle is standing in contravention of the provisions of this Order, a civil enforcement officer may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with those provisions or he may, under the provisions of the Removal and Disposal of Vehicles Regulations 1986(f), as amended, remove or cause to be removed the vehicle and, where it is so removed, shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle.
