ENNERDALE ROAD, KEW FITZWILLIAM AVENUE, KEW

- NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames on 25 January 2018 made the above-mentioned Order under sections 9 and 10 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
- 2. The general effect of the Order is to extend the existing double yellow lines ("no waiting at any time") at Ennerdale Road / Fitzwilliam Avenue, Kew junction so that they are sited: -
 - (a) Ennerdale Road, Kew on its western side, from a point 12 metres south of its junction with Fitzwilliam Avenue to a point 10.7 metres north of its junction with Fitzwilliam Avenue;
 - (b) Ennerdale Road, Kew on its eastern side, from a point 11.9 metres south of its junction with Fitzwilliam Avenue to a point 12.3 metres north of its junction with Fitzwilliam Avenue; and
 - (c) **Fitzwilliam Avenue, Kew** from a point 7 metres east of its junction with Ennerdale Road to a point 7 metres west of its junction with Ennerdale Road.
- 3. Full details of the Order, which will come into operation on 5 February 2018, are contained in the following documents: -
 - (a) the Order:
 - (b) a plan indicating the location and effect of the restrictions; and
 - (c) the Council's Statement of Reasons for making the Order.

until the date on which the Order ceases to have effect.

- 5. This Order provides that in pursuance of section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 the Assistant Director of Environment of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames, or other person authorised in that behalf by that officer may, if it appears to that officer or to that person essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic, or of the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on the highway, or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the roads affected by this Order run, modify or suspend the Order or any provision thereof.
- 6. If the provisions of this Order continue in operation for a period of not less than six months, the Council will consider in due course whether the its provisions should be reproduced and continued in force indefinitely by means of an Order under section 6 of the said Act of 1984. Persons wishing to object to or support the making of such an

Order for the purpose of such reproduction and continuation in force may, within the period of six months referred to above send a statement in writing of their objection and the grounds of that objection to the address below.

The Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames, having consulted the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 9 and 10 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), as amended, hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984" and all other enabling powers hereby make the following Order —

- 1. This Order shall come into operation on 5 February 2018 and may be cited as the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Civil Enforcement Area) (No. 1) Experimental Order 2018.
- In this Order the expression "enactment" means any enactment whether public, general or local and includes any order, bye-law, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment.
 - (2) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
 - (3) The Interpretation Act 1978(b) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3. Whilst this Order continues in force the provisions of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Civil Enforcement Area) (Consolidation No. 8) Order 2008(c), as amended, shall have effect as though: -
 - (a) for the item numbered 228 and 250 in that Order there was substituted the Item similarly numbered and set out in columns 1, 2 and 3 of Schedule 1 to this Order;
- 4. In pursuance of section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 the Assistant Director, Traffic and Engineering of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames, as the specified officer, or some person authorised in that behalf by that officer may, if it appears to that officer or to that person essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic, or of the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on the highway, or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the road affected by this Order runs, modify or suspend this Order or any provision thereof.

STATEMENT OF REASONS

The Council receives reports from time to time on matters of road safety caused by parked vehicles and these may come from residents, Councilors, Council officers or bus and emergency services. These matters include poor sight lines at junctions, obstruction of footway crossing points, lack of suitable passing areas and reduced carriageway width restricting or preventing access for vehicles especially emergency service vehicles.

This Order is intended to improve road safety for all users by introducing waiting restrictions "no waiting at any time" at the locations contained within the Notice of Making, Experimental Traffic Management Order and accompanying drawing. Similar restrictions have proved effective in locations elsewhere in the borough that previously suffered similar problems.

This scheme is being introduced on an experimental basis to give the Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames powers to make modifications or variations to the scheme in the light of operational experience.

The Council will consider in due course whether to make permanent Orders the effect of which will be to reproduce and continue in force indefinitely the provisions of these Orders
