ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 - SECTION 14 (2)

Temporary Waiting Restrictions Queens Road, Richmond

(Ref: 18/039)

- The Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames HEREBY GIVES NOTICE that due to the need to facilitate a water connection, they will introduce a waiting restriction in Queens Road, Richmond.
- Whilst the works take place, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait or stand in Queens Road, on its south-eastern side, between its junctions with Cambrian Road and Chisolm Road,
- 3. The restrictions will come into force on 10 February 2018. Further details regarding the dates and times of the closure are explained in paragraph 5 of this notice.
- 4. Nothing in this Notice will apply to:
 - (a) any vehicle being used in connection with the execution of the said works;
 - (b) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police officer in uniform or a civil enforcement officer;
 - (c) any vehicle being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes.
- 5. The temporary restrictions will be introduced by a notice given under Section 14(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended. The notice will come into effect on at 10am on 10 February 2018 and remain in force at all rimes for a period of 5 days or until the works are completed, whichever is the sooner. If the works should take longer than 5 days then the Council will make a temporary Traffic Order under S14(1) of the said Act to continue in force the provisions of this Notice for up to 18 months. The works are expected to be completed on 13 February 2018.
- 6. The prohibitions will apply only during such time and to such extent as indicated by prescribed traffic signs.
- 7. Any vehicle waiting in contravention of any restriction imposed by the Order may be removed under the provisions of the Removal and Disposal of Vehicles Regulations 1986.
