

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 – SECTION 16A

**THE LONDON BOROUGH OF RICHMOND UPON THAMES (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF
TRAFFIC) (SPECIAL EVENTS) (BARNES FAIR) ORDER 2018**

BARNES FAIR

(Reference 18/157)

1. The Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames hereby gives notice that on 9 July 2018 they made the above-named Order under Section 16A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
2. The general effect of the Order is to facilitate the holding of a parade for Barnes Fair. The parade will assemble at 10.20am and commence at around 11am. The road closures detailed in Section 3 below will be on a rolling basis and normal traffic operations will be resumed after the parade has passed through a restricted street.
3. From 10am until 12 noon on Saturday 14 July 2018, no person may permit a vehicle to enter or proceed in the following roads whilst the parade is in progress: -
 - (a) Barnes High Street from its junction with Lonsdale Road to its junction with Church Road;
 - (b) Church Road from its junction with Barnes High Street to its junction with Rocks Lane;
 - (c) Glebe Road from its junction with Church Road to its junction with Ranelagh Avenue.
4. Nothing in this Order will apply to:
 - (a) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a Police Constable, Police Community Support Officer or a civil enforcement officer;
 - (b) any vehicle being used by a statutory undertaker, whereby it is necessary by reason of an emergency, for that vehicle to have access to part of the street under restriction.
5. The prohibitions or restrictions specified in this notice will apply only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs prescribed by the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016.
6. Any vehicle waiting in contravention of any restriction imposed by the Order may be removed under the provisions of the Removal and Disposal of Vehicles Regulations 1986.

TEMPORARY TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ORDER

THE LONDON BOROUGH OF RICHMOND UPON THAMES (TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC) (SPECIAL EVENTS) (BARNES FAIR) ORDER 2016

Made: 9 July 2018

Comes into operation: 14 July 2018

WHEREAS the Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (hereinafter referred to as “The Council”) being the traffic authority for all streets within the said London borough, with the exception of those streets which are part of the Transport for London Road Network and those which are Crown roads within the Royal Parks of Richmond Park and Bushy Park, (hereinafter referred to as “the borough roads”) is satisfied that an event, the particulars of which are given in Article 2 of the following order, should be held on certain parts of the borough roads and that vehicular traffic should be prohibited and parking restricted in order to facilitate the holding of that event and to enable members of the public to watch that event.

NOW THEREFORE the Council in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 16A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), as amended, and of all other enabling powers hereby makes the following Order:

Commencement and citation

1. This Order shall come into operation on 14 July 2018 and may be cited as the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) (Special Events) (Barnes Fair) Order 2018 and shall remain in force for 1 day.

The Event and Interpretation

2. (1) The event for which this order makes provision is the Barnes Fair Parade.

- (2) In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:

“restricted hours” means between 10am and 12 noon and these hours shall apply on the day of the event only;

“police community support officer” means a person who has been so designated by the Metropolitan Police Service as provided for by Section 38 of the Police Reform Act 2002(b), and

“accredited person” means a person who has been accredited by the Metropolitan Police Service under the Community Safety Accreditation Scheme as provided for by Section 41 of that Act;

and in either case whilst exercising the powers of a police community support officer or an accredited person that person is wearing an approved uniform as provided for by Section 42(2) of that Act.

Prohibition or restriction of vehicular traffic

3. During the restricted hours, no person may cause any vehicle to proceed in any of the streets listed below whilst the parade is in progress (whether moving or stationary) in any such street and for short periods before and after the parade is in progress:-
 - (a) Barnes High Street from its junction with Lonsdale Road to its junction with Church Road;
 - (b) Church Road from its junction with Barnes High Street to its junction with Rocks Lane;
 - (c) Glebe Road from its junction with Church Road to its junction with Ranelagh Avenue.
4. Nothing in Article 3 of this order shall apply to any vehicle being used in connection with the said event or to any utility vehicle.
5. Nothing in this order shall apply:
 - (a) to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police officer in uniform, traffic warden, police community support officer or an accredited person;
 - (b) to any vehicle on an occasion when it is being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes, if the observance of that provision would be likely to hinder the use of the vehicle for the purpose for which it is being used on that occasion.
6. The provisions of this order will only apply during such times when it is necessary or expedient to prohibit or restrict vehicular traffic in the road(s) or length of road(s) specified in Article 3 of this order and to such extent as is at the time indicated by traffic signs prescribed by the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016(c), as amended.

Contravention

7. If a vehicle fails to comply with the provisions of this Order, a contravention shall be deemed to have occurred and a penalty charge shall be payable. A penalty charge notice showing the information required by the Traffic Management Act 2004(c) may then be issued by a civil enforcement officer in accordance with the requirements of that Act.
