**ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 – SECTION 16A
Temporary Restrictions
Duke Street and Quadrant Road, Richmond**

(Reference 19/039)

1. The Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames HEREBY GIVES NOTICE that to facilitate filming on the public highway, they have made a temporary Order, the effect of which is to introduce restrictions in Duke Street and Quadrant Road, Richmond.
2. Whilst the filming is in progress,
 - (a) no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to proceed, wait or stand in Duke Street between its junctions with The Green and The Quadrant;
 - (b) no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to proceed, wait or stand in Quadrant Road Richmond; and
 - (c) the one-way working in Quadrant Road shall be suspended.
3. The Order will come into effect on Tuesday 2 April 2019 at 07.00 and remain in force until 20.00 on that day. The restrictions will apply at such times and to such an extent as indicated by traffic signs.
4. An alternative route for traffic affected by the closure of Quadrant Road will be available via The Quadrant, Eton Street, Red Lion Street, George Street and vice versa
5. An alternative route for vehicles affected by the closure of Duke Street will be available via Little Green, Parkshot, Clarence Street, Kew Road, A316 Richmond Circus, Kew Road, and The Quadrant.
6. Nothing in the Order applies to:
 - (a) any vehicle being used in connection with the filming;
 - (b) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police officer in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer; or
 - (c) emergency service vehicles.

**TEMPORARY TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ORDER
THE LONDON BOROUGH OF RICHMOND UPON THAMES (TEMPORARY
RESTRICTION OF TRAFFIC) (VARIOUS STREETS, RICHMOND) (No. 3)
(FILMING) ORDER 2019**

Made: 21 March 2019

Comes into operation: 2 April 2019

WHEREAS the Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (hereinafter referred to as “The Council”) being the traffic authority for all streets within the said London borough, with the exception of those streets which are part of the Transport for London Road Network and those which are Crown roads within the Royal Parks of Richmond Park and Bushy Park, (hereinafter referred to as “the borough roads”) is satisfied that traffic should be restricted to enable a filming event to take place.

NOW THEREFORE the Council in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 16A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), as amended, and of all other enabling powers hereby makes the following Order:

Commencement and citation

1. This Order shall come into operation on 2 April 2019 and may be cited as the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) (Various Streets, Richmond) (No. 3) (Filming) Order 2019 and shall remain in force for one day.

The Event and Interpretation

2. (1) The event for which this order makes provision is a filming event in and around Richmond;
- (2) In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:

“restricted hours” means between 07.00 and 20.00;

“police community support officer” means a person who has been so designated by the Metropolitan Police Service as provided for by Section 38 of the Police Reform Act 2002(b), and

“accredited person” means a person who has been accredited by the Metropolitan Police Service under the Community Safety Accreditation Scheme as provided for by Section 41 of that Act;

and in either case whilst exercising the powers of a police community support officer or an accredited person that person is wearing an approved uniform as provided for by Section 42(2) of that Act.

Prohibition or restriction of vehicular traffic

3. During the restricted hours, or at such times as stated in items (a) – (c), at such times and to such an extent as indicated by traffic signs, and at such times and to such an extent as required by a police constable or an accredited person,
 - (a) between 10am and 1pm, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to proceed, wait or stand in Duke Street between its junctions with The Green and The Quadrant;
 - (b) no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to proceed, wait or stand in Quadrant Road Richmond; and
 - (c) Item 3 to the Schedule of The Richmond upon Thames (Prescribed Routes) (No. 1) Traffic Order 1973 **(c)** (shall be suspended, the effect being that the one-way working in Quadrant Road shall be suspended.
4. Nothing in Article 3 of this order shall apply to any vehicle being used in connection with the said event or to any utility vehicle.
5. Nothing in this order shall apply:
 - (a) to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police officer in uniform, traffic warden, police community support officer or an accredited person.
 - (b) to any vehicle on an occasion when it is being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes, if the observance of that provision would be likely to hinder the use of the vehicle for the purpose for which it is being used on that occasion
6. The provisions of this order will only apply during such times when it is necessary or expedient to prohibit or restrict vehicular traffic in the road(s) or length of road(s) specified in Article 3 of this order and to such extent as is at the time indicated by traffic signs prescribed by the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016**(d)**, as amended.

Alteration of position of/or removal of vehicles

7. Where any vehicle is standing in contravention of the provisions of this order, a civil enforcement officer may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with those provisions or he may remove or cause to be removed the vehicle and, where it is so removed, shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle.

Contravention

8. If a vehicle is left during the restricted hours without complying with the requirements of this order, a contravention shall have occurred, and a penalty charge shall be payable. A penalty charge notice showing the information required by the Traffic Management Act 2004**(e)** may then be issued by a civil enforcement officer in accordance with the requirements of the said Act.

Manner of payment of the penalty charge

9. The penalty charge shall be paid to the Council as provided for by Schedule 2 to the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (Manner of Payment of Penalty Charges) Order 2011**(f)**.
