ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 - SECTION 16A

THE LONDON BOROUGH OF RICHMOND UPON THAMES (SPECIAL EVENTS) (HAMPTON COURT PALACE FLOWER SHOW) ORDER 2019

UPPER SUNBURY ROAD, HAMPTON

(Reference 18/111)

- The Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames with the agreement of Surrey County Council on the on 1 July 2019 made the above Order under Section 16A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended. The Order shall come into operation on 4 July 2019 and remain in force for 2 days.
- 2. The general effect of this Order is to provide for the safe and expeditious movement of traffic during the Hampton Court Palace Flower Show on days when traffic flows are expected to be particularly high.
- 3. From 9am until 2pm on both Thursday 4 July 2019 and Friday 5 July 2019 no person may permit a vehicle proceeding in an easterly direction in Lower Sunbury Road, upon reaching its junction with Upper Sunbury Road, to enter Upper Sunbury Road.
- 4. An alternative route for vehicles affected by the closure shall be via French Street, Staines Road East and Upper Sunbury Road.
- 5. The road closures will apply only during such time and to such extent as indicated by prescribed traffic signs.

TEMPORARY TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ORDER

THE LONDON BOROUGH OF RICHMOND UPON THAMES) (SPECIAL EVENTS) (HAMPTON COURT PALACE FLOWER SHOW) ORDER 2019

Made: 1 July2019

Comes into operation: 4 July 2019

WHEREAS the Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (hereinafter referred to as "The Council") being the traffic authority for all streets within the said London borough, with the exception of those streets which are part of the Transport for London Road Network and those which are Crown roads within the Royal Parks of Richmond Park and Bushy Park, (hereinafter referred to as "the borough roads") and with the agreement of Surrey County Council is satisfied that an event, the particulars of which are given in Article 2 of the following order, should be held on certain parts of the borough roads and that vehicular traffic should be prohibited and parking restricted in order to facilitate the holding of that event and to enable members of the public to attend that event.

NOW THEREFORE the Council in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 16A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), as amended, and of all other enabling powers hereby makes the following Order:

Commencement and citation

1. This Order shall come into operation on 4 July 2019 and may be cited as the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (Special Events) (Hampton Court Palace Flower Show) Order 2019 and shall remain in force for a maximum period of 2 days.

The Event and Interpretation

- 2. (1) The event for which this order makes provision is the Hampton Court Palace Flower Show and the restrictions are required to ensure the safe and expeditious movement of traffic on days when there is expected to be a high volume of traffic in the area.
 - (2) In this Order, "restricted hours" means between 9am and 2pm and these hours shall apply on Thursday 4 July 2019 and Friday 5 July 2019.

Prohibition or restriction of vehicular traffic

3. During the restricted hours no person may permit a vehicle proceeding in an easterly direction in Lower Sunbury Road, upon reaching its junction with Upper Sunbury Road to enter Upper Sunbury Road.

- 4. Nothing in Article 3 of this order shall apply to any vehicle being used in connection with the said event or to any utility vehicle.
- 5. Nothing in this order shall apply:
 - (a) to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police officer in uniform or a civil enforcement officer.
 - (b) to any vehicle on an occasion when it is being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes, if the observance of that provision would be likely to hinder the use of the vehicle for the purpose for which it is being used on that occasion.
- 6. The provisions of this order will only apply during such times when it is necessary or expedient to prohibit or restrict vehicular traffic in the road(s) or length of road(s) specified in Article 3 of this order and to such extent as is at the time indicated by traffic signs prescribed by the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016(b), as amended.

Contravention

7. If a vehicle fails to comply with the provisions of this Order, a contravention shall be deemed to have occurred and a penalty charge shall be payable. A penalty charge notice showing the information required by the Traffic Management Act 2004(c) may then be issued by a civil enforcement officer in accordance with the requirements of that Act.
