

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 – SECTION 16A

**THE LONDON BOROUGH OF RICHMOND UPON THAMES (TEMPORARY  
PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC) (SPECIAL EVENTS) (HAM COMMON HAM FILMING)  
ORDER 2020**

**HAM COMMON, HAM**

(Reference 20/009)

1. The Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames hereby gives notice that on 8 January 2020 they made the above-named Order under Section 16A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
2. The general effect of the Order is to introduce temporary waiting restrictions to facilitate filming.
3. From 06.30 on 13 January 2020 until 19.30 on 16 January 2020, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait or stand in the following lengths of Ham Common -
  - (a) the north-eastern side, from a point 15 metres north-west of the western kerb-line of Upper Ham Road, north-westwards for a distance of 52 metres;
  - (b) the north-eastern side, from a point 82 metres north-west of the western kerb-line of Upper Ham Road, north-westwards for a distance of 103 metres.
4. Nothing in this Order will apply to:
  - (a) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a Police Constable, Police Community Support Officer, accredited marshal or a civil enforcement officer.
  - (b) any vehicle being used by a statutory undertaker, whereby it is necessary by reason of an emergency, for that vehicle to have access to part of the street under restriction;
  - (c) any vehicle being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes.
5. The prohibitions or restrictions specified in this notice will apply only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs prescribed by the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016.
6. Any vehicle waiting in contravention of any restriction imposed by the Order may be removed under the provisions of the Removal and Disposal of Vehicles Regulations 1986.

## **TEMPORARY TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ORDER**

### **THE LONDON BOROUGH OF RICHMOND UPON THAMES (FILMING) (HAM COMMON, HAM) ORDER 2020**

Made: 8 January 2020

Comes into operation: 13 January 2020

WHEREAS the Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (hereinafter referred to as "The Council") being the traffic authority for all streets within the said London borough, with the exception of those streets which are part of the Transport for London Road Network and those which are Crown roads within the Royal Parks of Richmond Park and Bushy Park, (hereinafter referred to as "the borough roads") is satisfied that traffic should be restricted to enable filming take place.

NOW THEREFORE the Council in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 16A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), as amended, and of all other enabling powers hereby makes the following Order:

#### **Commencement and citation**

1. This Order shall come into operation on 13 January 2020 and may be cited as the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Filming) (Ham Common, Ham) Order 2020 and shall remain in force for 5 days.

#### **The Event and Interpretation**

2. (1) The event for which this order makes provision is a filming event in Ham;
- (2) In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:

"restricted hours" means between 06.30 on 16 January 2020 and 19.30 on 16 January 2020.

#### **Prohibition or restriction of vehicular traffic**

3. During the restricted hours, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait or stand in the following lengths of Ham Common -
  - (a) the north-eastern side, from a point 15 metres north-west of the western kerb-line of Upper Ham Road, north-westwards for a distance of 52 metres;
  - (b) the north-eastern side, from a point 82 metres north-west of the western kerb-line of Upper Ham Road, north-westwards for a distance of 103 metres
- (c) Nothing in Article 3 of this order shall apply to any vehicle being used in connection with the said event or to any utility vehicle.

- (d) Nothing in this order shall apply:
- (a) to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police officer in uniform or civil enforcement officer;
  - (b) to any vehicle on an occasion when it is being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes, if the observance of that provision would be likely to hinder the use of the vehicle for the purpose for which it is being used on that occasion
6. The provisions of this order will only apply during such times when it is necessary or expedient to prohibit or restrict vehicular traffic in the road(s) or length of road(s) specified in Article 3 of this order and to such extent as is at the time indicated by traffic signs prescribed by the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016**(b)**, as amended.

**Alteration of position of/or removal of vehicles**

7. Where any vehicle is standing in contravention of the provisions of this order, a civil enforcement officer may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with those provisions or he may remove or cause to be removed the vehicle and, where it is so removed, shall provide for the safe custody of the vehicle.

**Contravention**

8. If a vehicle is left during the restricted hours without complying with the requirements of this order, a contravention shall have occurred and a penalty charge shall be payable. A penalty charge notice showing the information required by the Traffic Management Act 2004**(c)** may then be issued by a civil enforcement officer in accordance with the requirements of the said Act.

**Manner of payment of the penalty charge**

9. The penalty charge shall be paid to the Council as provided for by Schedule 2 to the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames (Manner of Payment of Penalty Charges) Order 2011**(d)**.
