

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 – SECTION 14 (2)

Temporary Restrictions Hospital Bridge Road and Montrose Avenue, Whitton

(Reference 15/112)

- 1. The Council of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames HEREBY GIVES NOTICE that to facilitate junction improvement works and to allow for a bus diversion they will introduce a road closure in Hospital Bridge Road and temporary waiting restrictions in Montrose Avenue.
- 2. Whilst the works take place,
 - (a) no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to proceed in Hospital Bridge Road in a northerly direction at its junctions with Powder Mill Lane and Percy Road;
 - (b) no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait or stand in Montrose Avenue on both sides between Nos 82 and 88, 42 and 48 and from its junction with Hospital Bridge Road to a point outside No 97 where signs/cones are placed.
- 3. The provisions of this notice will come into force on 11 July 2015. Further details of the dates of the restrictions are contained in Paragraph 6.
- 4. An alternative route for vehicles affected by the closure shall be via Percy Road, High Street, Whitton and Nelson Road.
- 5. Nothing in this Notice will apply to:
 - (a) any vehicle being used in connection with the execution of the said works; or
 - (b) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police officer in uniform or a traffic warden.
- 6. The temporary restrictions will be introduced by a notice given under Section 14(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended. The notice will come into effect at 8am on Saturday 11 July 2015 and remain in force until 6pm on Wednesday 15 July 2015, that is, for a period of 5 days, or until the works are completed, whichever is the sooner. The works are anticipated to be in progress for 2 days only.
- 7. The restriction will apply only during such time and to such extent as indicated by prescribed traffic signs.
